Course Description: This course is meant to provide an introductory understanding of the Earth sciences; geology, meteorology, oceanography, and astronomy. POLICIES

Course Attendance Policy

It is extremely important that you come to class. For the purpose of reporting absences, there are no “excused absences.” Excessive absences may result in termination from the course.
